VARIOUS PROCEDURES

W.I.N "Whatever I Need"

- What is WIN?
- Win is a school wide enrichment and intervention block to provide each student with what they need. Students shift to different classrooms to receive the support they need on current skills being taught. WIN occurs from 800-8:30 M, Tu, Th, F
- How are WIN groups created?
- Teachers sit weekly and review data from formatives, summatives, and classroom observations to determine what each student needs weekly.

FAST Test

- We take the state reading and math FAST test at the beginning, middle, and end of the year.
- Students will also take a writing FAST test in the spring. It will be between March 30th and April 10th.
- Dates will be in our weekly newsletter.

HOMEWORK

Reading

- Weekly Reading Log Over the week we are asking students to read 100 minutes per week. This would be about 20 minutes per day.
- Complete at least 3 activities on the reading log.
- Students will get the reading log
 on Monday, and it will be due the
 next Monday. Parent signature is
 required when turned in.

Math

- At the beginning of each unit, students will receive review trifolds for each standard learned in the unit.
- Students will complete the trifolds throughout the unit, and they will be due on the day of the test.
 - Due dates change. They will be on the trifolds and in the newsletter.

GRADEBOOK

Summative (Unit tests): 70% Formative (Quizzes and classwork): 30%

-Reteach and retest policy:

 Students who score below a 79% on a summative assessment, will be retaught and retested on the skill. Students can retest and score up to an 80%.
