VARIOUS PROCEDURES

Attendance: It is important that your child be in class every day that is possible. School begins at 8:00 AM and dismisses at 2:20 PM. Wednesday's school begins at 8:00 and dismisses at 1:20.

<u>Tardiness:</u> A child is considered tardy after 8:00a.m. If for some reason you are late, please escort your child into the office to obtain a tardy slip.

Absence: Please send in a note with your child when returning to school following an illness. The office needs the excuse in writing for their records. Make up work will be given upon return.

Recess: Wear proper shoes each day.

Medication: Contact the school nurse

VARIOUS PROCEDURES CONT.

<u>Excused Absences:</u> When your child is absent from school, please remember that our registrar must be notified via handwritten note or in email. Excuse notes can ONLY be accepted within 48 hours of a student returning to school; however, this does not necessarily mean the absence will be excused. Family vacations, birthday parties, shopping trips, suspension from school, and other avoidable absences are unexcused.


<u>Transportation Changes:</u> All transportation changes need to be emailed to: piatransportation@stjohns.k12.fl.us

Cell phone, smart watch, and other wireless communication devices:

- In accordance with House Bill 1105, the use of wireless communication devices (phones, smart watches, ear buds, etc.) by elementary and middle school students is strictly prohibited during the school day (no use on campus).
- Students are permitted to possess cellular phones and other wireless communication (smart watches) devices on school grounds, school buses, and at school-sponsored events. However, all devices must remain powered off and securely stored in a student's backpack, purse, locker, or vehicle during the school day.
- Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in the confiscation of the device. Repeated violations will be treated as defiance of school rules and may lead to disciplinary consequences.
- If you need to contact your child throughout the day, please direct all calls to the
 office.

- Chaperones must be 18 years or older and have <u>School Access</u>
- Bus Chaperones
 - Selection will be by lottery for each class.
 - Teachers will notify you if you are chosen for a bus seat.
 - Bus riding chaperones pay the full trip cost through School Pay.
 - You and your child are required to ride the bus there and back.
- Driving Chaperones
 - Only pays the cost of the ticket through School Pay.
 - Transportation and parking are your responsibility.
 - Driving chaperones may submit payment right away.
 - Your child is required to ride the bus to SeaWorld; however, he/she can be checked out with your child's teacher to ride home with you.
